Hackathon AlNaqab

Siraj held Israel's first Hackathon, an application development competition for Bedouin teens, in Be'er Sheva on April 7. The inaugural event convened fifty 10th and 11th graders from the towns and cities of Hura, Rahat, Rahme, Umm Batin, and Nitzana. Students competed in groups of five to develop applications, with creative inventions including apps to help people with poor vision send text messages, calculate a household's electricity usage, borrow second-hand books, and order meals for children in orphanages. Students were guided by technological mentors including their teachers (who had been trained by Siraj prior to the event) and engineers from Siraj Technologies. We were proud to host a



stellar panel of judges that included leaders from medicine, academia, education, and engineers from DELL EMC.

We cannot overstate the impact of events like the Hackathon, as well as our ongoing outreach. They create a buzz that quickly multiplies in the tight-knit Bedouin community and have a powerful effect on the communal perception of hi-tech. We estimate that through publicity and word-of-mouth, including coverage in Arabic press, news of the Hackathon reached 10,000 people! The Hackathon was made possible in partnership with the Tamar Center and several Bedouin municipalities.



School Visits

So far in the 2018-2019 school year, Siraj has engaged with 220 students at 7 high schools in the towns of Rahat, Lakiya, Tel Sheva, Abu Tlul, Nitzana, and Qasr Al'Sar. These include hosting groups of students at our offices at WeWork Be'er Sheva, where they interact first-hand with a hi-tech work environment, as well as visits by Siraj NGO staff and Siraj Ltd. engineers to high school math and science classes.



Meetups

Meetups provide an opportunity for high school students as well as university students and young professionals to network in a professional, tech-focused environment. Our latest meetup took place in February and included a lecture by the Head of Development at Netafim. Approximately 80 young people attended.
